Rooted in authenticity, Carlton's work captures both the boy he was at six and the man he is today—a candid portrait of growth, experience, and becoming.

Born in Baltimore, his early life was shaped by jazz, odd jobs, and time spent on construction sites with his mother. Painting walls and handling tools, he unknowingly gathered the materials—both literal and emotional—that would later inform his artistic practice. These formative experiences fostered a resilience that now underpins his creative approach.

Portraiture and spatial composition are central to Carlton's work, creating spaces that evoke intimacy, distance, and presence. He draws inspiration from the crisp layers of Alex Katz, the vivid storytelling of David Hockney, and the deeply rooted narratives of Kerry James Marshall. Through gesture, color, and form, Carlton reimagines the everyday—offering viewers alternative ways of seeing, beyond static or expected narratives.

Rather than being tied to traditional materials, Carlton prioritizes process. He paints on whatever surfaces are available, guided by a restless curiosity and an openness to wherever inspiration may arise. His practice is exploratory and instinctual—an unfiltered response to his surroundings.

For Carlton, art is more than a form of expression—it's a means of survival. As he puts it, "we are the last of a dying breed."











Timothy Yarger entered the art business in 1982 and has been a Los Angeles based art dealer since 1986. After directing galleries in San Francisco, New York and Beverly Hills, Timothy Yarger Fine Art, Inc. was established in 1997. Timothy Yarger Fine Art has exclusive artist representation of contemporary artists in primary markets and secondary market expertise, which compliments its scholarship in historic material of the 20th Century. The gallery produces regular exhibition programming, alongside its services in assisting individuals in building and managing their collections.

Throughout the gallery's history, TYFA has had a particular interest in the Los Angeles based movement of Light and Space and has worked with James Turrell, Robert Irwin and Peter Alexander. Creating light in all techniques continues to inform our gallery roster and the next generation of artists such as Mads Christensen, Udo Noger, Conrad Leach, Pancho Luna and Robert Stone.

TYFA promotes scholarship, broad connoisseurship, and public programming through collaboration with art historians, critics, and museum professionals, who contribute to the galleries' events and publications. TYFA is dedicated to advancing the careers of their artists while contributing to the contemporary art dialogue.

Timothy Yarger began mounting exhibitions internationally in 1995 and since 2002 has conducted more than 20 exhibitions on preeminent 20th Century artists, included Andy Warhol, Roy Lichtenstein, Pablo Picasso, David Hockney, Pierre-Auguste Renoir, Joan Miro, Marc Chagall, as well as selected group exhibitions of established contemporary artists. TYFA has provided exhibitions for other galleries in the United States, China, Southeast Asia and Europe.
